The Urban Transitions Mission

The Urban Transitions Mission Centre (UTMC) is a Horizon Europe-funded project supporting the implementation of the UTM. Building on the European Mission for Climate-Neutral and Smart Cities, UTMC supports the activities of the Urban Transitions Mission, and it enables a wide international knowledge and practice network of cities and urban stakeholders that will help drive transitions globally.

The Urban Transitions Mission (UTM) mobilises decision makers across all levels of government to prioritise climate-neutral and net-zero pathways enabled by clean energy and systemic innovation across all sectors and in urban governance. By accelerating capacity-building and closing the gap between research, development and deployment, the Mission empowers cities to adopt innovative solutions and help reach tipping points in the cost and scale of those solutions for urban transitions. The UTM is co-led by the European Commission, the Global Covenant of Mayors for Climate and Energy (GCoM) and JPI Urban Europe. It has been launched in the framework of Mission Innovation - a global initiative of 23 countries and the European Commission (on behalf of the European Union) catalysing a decade of action and investment in research, development and demonstration to make clean energy affordable, attractive and accessible for all.

Covenant of Mayors

The Covenant of Mayors for Climate & Energy – Europe is an initiative supported by the European Commission bringing together thousands of local governments that want to secure a better future for their citizens. By joining the initiative, they voluntarily commit to implementing EU climate and energy objectives.

DUT Partnership

The DUT partnership is a public-public partnership, co-funded by 28 European countries and the European Commission under Horizon Europe. DUT aims to contribute significantly to the European and global mission on climate-neutral cities, the European Green Deal, and the Urban Agenda for the EU by developing and implementing a transformative research and innovation (R&I) programme. In order to enhance the impact of the R&I investments for local action, a comprehensive programme management is established including capacity building measures and creating evidence with and for cities and urban actors.

Cities Mission projects – Urban Planning and Design Cluster

The 'Urban Planning and Design Cluster' is represented by projects [CLIMABOROUGH](#), [Re-Value](#) and [UP2030](#). The objective of the Cluster is to support a diverse range of urban areas in cities across Europe to identify, plan, design, implement and replicate solutions to significantly reduce emissions across the most relevant sectors in cities and achieve climate neutrality, sustainability and resilience by 2030. Each project has developed a specific approach to achieve this. Re-Value focusses on re-valuing the cities' connection to their waterfronts, strengthening co-benefits and mitigating potential adverse impacts. CLIMABOROUGH concentrates on co-developing solutions together with innovative SMEs, start-ups and user communities to showcase the benefits and impacts of these demonstrations in cities across Europe. UP2030 will support cities in driving the socio-technical transitions required to meet their climate neutrality targets by leveraging urban planning and design and putting inclusive participation at the centre of their approach.

Cities Mission projects – Public Transport Cluster

The 'Public Transport Cluster' aims to strengthen the role of public transport as the cornerstone for decarbonising urban mobility in cities by promoting sustainable, accessible and inclusive public transport. Projects [UPPER](#) and [SPINE](#) represent this cluster and they will implement a combination of measures looking to push people out of private cars and to pull them closer to public transport in cities across Europe. Both projects will engage in active contributions with both Mission Cities and CIVITAS communities.

These projects build on the previous projects focused on public transport (e.g. [ELIPTIC](#), [CIPTEC](#), [DESTINATIONS](#)) which were also part of the [CIVITAS Initiative](#). CIVITAS is a network of over 340 cities dedicated to achieving ambitious mobility and transport goals, such as those of the 'European Green Deal' and the 'Sustainable and Smart Mobility Strategy'. The initiative launched by the European Commission in 2002 and it aims to increase the collective expertise and political commitment for the development and roll-out of 'green' and sustainable urban mobility measures. Since its launch, the CIVITAS Initiative has had five funding phases in which more than 80 demonstration cities have tested, implemented and evaluated integrated packages of urban mobility measures and solutions as part of the CIVITAS Living Lab projects. The CIVITAS Initiative is currently led by the coordination and support action CIVITAS MUSE, which delivers a wide range of services supporting the replication, take-up and deployment of sustainable urban mobility measures and solutions in cities.

Cities Mission projects – Positive Clean Energy Districts

The 'Positive Clean Energy Districts Cluster' aims to test large-scale Positive Clean Energy Districts under real life conditions. Projects [ASCEND](#) and [NEUTRALPATH](#) will analyse the main aspects of the successful conception and roll-out of Positive Energy Districts; explore combinations of demand and supply measures at district scale to identify the best cost-effective mix; and develop synergies between the built environment, energy communities, e-mobility, smart grids and energy storage. These projects will contribute to the Cities Mission and build on the experiences and knowledge gains in previous smart cities and communities projects which continue to collaborate through the [Scalable Cities](#) initiative.
